



Triggerguard, sand cast brass or nickel silver #TG-E-52-B or S

This interesting triggerguard is probably from a late Ohio fullstock longrifle, or a similar school of style. It is a bit different from any other we have seen. The large bow invites double set triggers. Nickel silver became more common after 1820, and will make a good choice.

Triggerguard, wax cast yellow brass#TG-Vinc-1-B

A typical late Ohio longrifle style, this triggerguard has a comfortable grip rail, large bow for double set triggers, and the forward finger spur. This triggerguard works well with our pre-inlet Vincent halfstock.
